Plan and make a main meal for your family that costs less than £1 per head. Photograph the meal and write out the recipe. Write a review of the meal!</p>
<p>Write Write a story based in WW2. You could write from the point of view of a soldier or as a child left back at home. You can make up your own story or base your story on one you have read or watched on TV.
